
ALTAR AND ROSARY SOCIETY

THE CANON OF THE MASS

PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH MILITANT: NOBIS QUOQUE PECCATORIBUS

Throughout the Mass, the Church invites the priest to manifest his sentiments of profound humility. It is thus that he strikes his breast while saying "To us sinners also."

Poor creatures that we are! What a responsibility it is to participate in what is essential to Jesus Christ: His Redemption, His priesthood, His royalty! What a responsibility the priest has before all the faithful! With what humility you must accomplish these holy mysteries!

A deep faith in Our Lord necessarily makes us humble; it is a consequence of adoring Our Lord. And that is why our Mass is so beautiful, because it is a constant manifestation of our adoration of the Lord.

The result of contact with the good God in prayer..., and in the Mass, must be an increase of humility. If vanity or a little pride results because we have the feeling that the good God gives us particular graces, more than to others, then it is our imagination that is working; it is not the reality, it is not really the light of the good God or of the Holy Ghost that is enlightening us. The nearer we draw to God, as St. Thomas says,... "The more someone knows God, the more he is convinced that he knows Him less." These are golden words. Everything that can make us approach God must have humility as the result...

Someone who doesn't know God thinks that when he pronounces the name of God he knows Him. It is a complete illusion. The most spiritual souls who draw near to God, who begin to perceive the great mysteries of God, the mysteries of the Creator, the Savior, the Redeemer, the Sanctifier, the Glorifier, discover with amazement that God is an ever greater mystery...: an immense ocean. The reaction of a spiritual soul, a soul that begins to understand that, must be humility. "My God, what am I in relation to this great mystery? I did not know that the good God was so great, so infinite, so powerful, so good, so merciful. I begin to discover it a little. Before this tiny discovery, I fall awe-struck." It is good to listen to St. Thomas,... to keep us also humble should we be tempted to tell ourselves, Ah! now I know the good God well. I've reached the summit. I'm sure to know the good God well.
