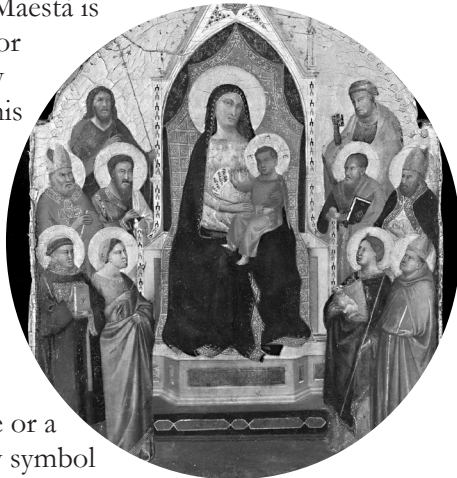

THE THRONE OF MARY: THE MAESTÀ

Originating from the Byzantine pictorial tradition, the Maestà is the representation of the Holy Virgin sitting on a throne, or “in majesty”. Hence its name. This type of painting is very common in the Middle Ages and until the Renaissance. This representation is also frequent in sculpture where we find at the same time many Virgins in Majesty.

Painting or sculpture, the pattern is always the same. The Virgin Mary is seated on a throne, carrying the Child Jesus in her arms and presenting him to the adoration of the faithful. In a shimmer of wings, angels often adorn this throne with their heavenly presence. The throne. This is the major pictorial element that indicates the royalty of the Virgin Mary. For it is not here an insignificant attribute or a purely decorative element. The throne is really the primary symbol of royal power, it is the place of power and the seat of the supreme judge. At a time when the states are all more or less constituted according to the monarchical form, representing the Virgin Mary on a throne is equivalent to a full affirmation of her royalty. And this is not the fruit of the imagination of artists. Art expresses reality. The painters and sculptors of the Maestà are simply taking up truths of faith already evoked in the Holy Scriptures. Thus the liturgical hymns proclaim Marie “Regina Caeli”, or acclaim her with the chant of “Salve Regina” and “Ave Regina Caelorum”. “Heaven and earth celebrate you as their mighty Queen,” reads the Mass and the Office of the Assumption. The Litany of the Virgin, which elaborates at length on the various kingdoms of Mary, also gives a valuable indication of the Church’s faith on the subject.



A Maestà is a virgin sitting on her royal throne. Why sitting? Because better than any other position, the seated position signifies full possession of her possessions. It expresses stability, a quiet assurance in what one is and in what one possesses. Sitting on a throne is therefore well suited to indicate royal power, stable, assured. To represent the Virgin Mary in majesty is to express clearly that she possesses in her perfection the royal power. Consequently, the prayer of the faithful before her throne is not only an act of praise, or a request for grace. It is also an act of submission to her kingship, an act by which one recognizes one’s dependence on the Mother of God. Dependence on what? To the whole work of our salvation. If Mary is Queen, it is to save men, that is, to apply to them the merits and graces of redemption. And man does not save himself alone. He is necessarily a subject and must show his dependence. How can this be done? By imitating the virtues of the Virgin Mary. The true faithful Christian shows in his conduct, in his way of life, and in his words that he is proud to be the subject of such a great queen.
