Dear Parishioners,

We must pray and we must pray with regularity. In fact, Our Lord says that "we ought to pray always." It is impossible for us to fulfill this to the letter. But if we understand Our Lord correctly and pray throughout the day, a person will find himself under the influence of a recent prayer. The divine office expresses this: "Divinum auxilium maneat semper nobiscum — may the Divine assistance remain always with us".

In terms of spiritual "success", it can be surprising to see how two siblings from the same family, or two students from the same class, or even two priests from the same ordination class can have very different and contrary outcomes. When analyzed, it will not be surprising to see that the disparity is found in the different practices of prayer. One believed and practiced it and another did not.

We must pray frequently. For this reason the Holy Ghost inspired the Church to establish certain times of prayer throughout the day. The priests and some religious observe what are called the canonical hours; times established for the recitation of the divine office. But, for religious and laity alike there are recommended practices of prayer throughout the day: the Angelus morning, noon and night; the morning and evening prayer; the rosary; prayers at mid-morning and mid-afternoon.

These times of prescribed prayer are from the Apostolic origin. At midnight, Paul and Silas were heard to pray while in prison (Acts 16:25). The Apostles were united in prayer at 9:00 a.m. when the Holy Ghost came upon them at Pentecost (Acts 2: 1-15). St. Peter goes to the roof of a house to pray at noon (Acts 10:10). Sts. Peter and John went to the temple to pray at 3:00 p.m., which Scripture calls a time of prayer (Acts 3:1). The Acts of the Apostles also mentions that the centurion Cornelius would pray at 3:00 p.m. even before he became a Christian.

There are many things in our life which distract from prayer, replace prayer and even give a distaste for prayer. Reorganize and reprioritize! Instead of working prayer around everything else in the day, work most everything of your day around the all-important duty of prayer.





Mr. and Mrs. Lenhard moved to Liberty, Missouri in June from Syracuse, New York.


Mrs. Lenhard is teaching history, science, and religion to the 6th grade at the Tracy campus. Mr. Lenhard is cataloguing


# \$100,000 Our goal
