

Work continues on the new school building and includes the following:

- A new fire alarm system has been installed replacing one that was out of date.
- The elevator has been repaired and maintenance has been performed to bring it up to certification level.
- Maintenance and repairs have been done for all six rooftop HVAC systems.
- Research is being done for the best phone/network/security system to be used for the new building.
- Looking at various equipment for summer mowing and winter snow removal.
- The architect is creating time schedules for implementing the

- construction of the new chapel and dining hall, as well as suggesting color schemes for the interior walls.
- Scheduling samples of finished concrete to resurface the classroom/hallway floors.

The school is being prepared for use in the 2020 - 2021 school year.
