THE CANON OF THE MASS

THE PRIEST’S LIFTING UP HIS EYES TO HEAVEN

At the moment of the Consecration, the priest, minister of the universal Mediator, must, like Him, lift up his eyes to heaven with an ardent desire to unite himself with the oblation of Christ, always living, who never ceases to intercede for us nor to offer to the Father together with Himself all the living members of His Mystical Body, especially those who suffer, following His example. Father Garrigou-Lagrange wrote truly moving things on this subject. One gets the feeling that he had a very special devotion to the Consecration: “Devotion to the Eucharistic consecration comprises something essential in Christian life; without it we can have no real interior life. The double consecration, the essence of the Holy Sacrifice, marks the most solemn moment of each day of our lives.”

THE WORDS OF THE CONSECRATION

1. *Hoc est enim... Hic est enim...*

The words of consecration are brief, certainly, but how weighty with meaning. “This”: It is the sacrifice of the Cross continued, perpetuated in its physical and mystical reality; it is the sacrifice of the Cross continued by the bread and wine consecrated to become substantially the Body and Blood of Jesus. “This”: It is the unbloody sacrifice of oblation of the living Christ, immolated on the Cross once and for all and continuing to intercede for us. “This”: It is the Body and Blood of the risen Jesus becoming the food of His Mystical Body, for from the sacrifice of the Cross flow the graces of resurrection for the souls of the faithful in baptism, penance, extreme unction, and in all the Sacraments.

As participants in the priesthood of Jesus Christ, ministers of the divine mysteries, chosen and marked by Our Lord’s election as priests for eternity, priests are ordained for the holy sacrifice of the Mass and for the sacrifice of the Cross, the two being substantially one and the same sacrifice of Our Lord. Thus, at the priest’s bidding, the Cross of Christ, to which is attached the Priest and Victim *par excellence*, is lifted up. Here is why the Word became flesh, here is what the Redeemer was for. “*Tota via crux et martyrium*—Your whole life was a cross and a martyrdom.”

2. *Corpus Meum*

The Catechism of the Council of Trent includes the following statements:

The priest is also one and the same, Christ the Lord; for the ministers who offer Sacrifice, consecrate the holy mysteries, not in their own person, but in that of Christ, as the words of consecration itself show, for the priest does not say: this is the body of Christ, but, This is my body; and thus, acting in the Person of Christ the Lord, he changes the substance of the bread and wine into the true substance of His Body and Blood.

This being the case, it must be taught without any hesitation that, as the holy Council (of Trent) has also explained, the sacred and holy Sacrifice of the Mass is not a Sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving only, or a mere commemoration of the Sacrifice performed on the cross, but also truly a propitiatory Sacrifice, by which God is appeased and rendered propitious to us.

This is what our faith teaches us.
