THE CANON OF THE MASS

THE SIGNS OF THE CROSS OVER THE HOST AND CHALICE continued

During the prayer *Quam oblationem*, the priest makes three Signs of the Cross over both the chalice and the host, then one over the host and another over the chalice. Thus, the Church always asks for grace through the merits of Our Lord's cross. It is by His merits that transubstantiation will take place. These Signs of the Cross lead us to Calvary, where Our Lord perfectly fulfilled the beatitudes.

- **Hunger and thirst after justice.** What else is there besides the Cross to suppress injustice and re-establish justice? To re-establish justice towards His Father and to re-establish love of neighbor: this is perhaps the principal object of Our Lord's desire to go up onto the Cross.
- Mercy. Where do we find Our Lord more merciful than on the Cross? His merciful heart wants to save souls; what more could He do in His desire to come to our aid and save us?
- **Purity of heart.** If there is a pure heart, it is indeed Our Lord's. His heart is truly turned completely towards His Father, swelled with the love He has for His Father and for all mankind. It is from this pierced heart that all pure hearts will come ever after. His heart will purify souls. He will be the source of all consecrated virginity, and of all chastity.
- Love of peace. What does Our Lord do on the Cross if not make peace? Our Lord came to appease God's wrath and re-establish peace.
- Persecutions suffered for God's sake. What is He on the Cross if not persecuted for God's sake.

We see that the beatitudes are fulfilled with an unsurpassed perfection on the Cross. And if we too want to truly practice the beatitudes, which are the ultimate effects of the presence of the Holy Ghost in souls and which prepare souls for heaven, then let us participate in the Cross of Jesus. Let us not be scared by difficulties, trials, and sufferings of all kind, big or small. That is our lot in life.

As it is well said in *The Imitation of Christ*, everyone has sufferings, but there is a great difference between those who suffer as Christians, in union with Our Lord, to win heaven, save souls, and atone for their sins and those who revolt against suffering. It would be very unfortunate if we who want to consecrate our whole life to the good God were to resemble those who have understood nothing of suffering. Let us willingly accept difficulties, trials, and contradictions in union with Our Lord, and then joy will fill our hearts. The more we practice the beatitudes, the more readily we accept all our crosses in imitation of Our Lord, the happier we shall be and the more joy will fill our souls.
