"We are reviled and we bless" I Cor 4;12

St. Paul's apology, which is evoked by three times between the Acts of the Apostles and his Epistles, bear the mark of the greatest Apostle of all times. Cut out all in one piece, full of zeal and passion, with the fire of God in his heart, the sword in his tongue and the motherly love in the heart. A masterpiece of genuine Paulinian writing and a mixture of grandeur and humility! What a gem!

In connection with the theme of his apology, "we are reviled and we bless", we priests are not uncommonly witnessing great souls precisely when they are facing suffering or death. Let's start with death first.

What is impressive is to see the many ways the dying react, and more so the way their surrounding family. As expected, souls closest to God through life find the encounter with death almost a prayer and an encouragement to total surrender. And, even when death's sting snatches a soul from the cradle, the Church prayers act as balm over the heart of the bereaved and helps them endure the separation with Christian resignation. These unsung heroes are really "bearing fruit in patience."

The next example I wish to bring up here, other examples of virtuous souls going through a kind of hellish time, coming from regular visits and mail from prisoners. Those which our traditional leaders have been attending are animated with a zeal for Tradition, for the True Mass and Catechism. We priests almost wish that many of our

own parishioners could be enclosed—for a time, mind you!—between walls. Something is most appreciated when taken away from you.

In jail, is this precious thing one's liberty? You would think it is. And yet, after a few contacts, we sense that the inmates have rediscovered that they have a soul, that this soul needs to be fed with a "supersubstantial bread", and not junk food, and that nothing but God, Christ, His Blessed Mother, can satisfy their hunger for true happiness. Their life can be physically and emotionally



unbearable—Texas inmates do not enjoy the luxury of air conditioning. Yes, you read correctly "Texas"! But, they have fewer distractions than people in the world. And so, they display a love of God, a yearning for the faith, a zeal for the conversion of their brothers which would put anyone to shame. And, from disciples, they quickly become leaders of prayer groups, public rosaries, and catechism to spread the true faith within these daunting walls.
